#### **Eligibility**

The journal invites contributions from legal practitioners, bureaucrats, policymakers, students and research scholars, NGOs and stakeholders with work expertise, interest in the domain, aiming to bridge the gap between theoretical analysis and practical application.

#### **Submission Guidelines for Authors**

- I. The work should be original and unpublished. It should not be under consideration for publication elsewhere and has not been published previously in any other publication.
- II. Co-authorship of up to two authors is allowed.
- III. Please submit your papers in the following format:

#### **Selection Process**

The manuscript received for publication in the journal shall be selected through a rigorous two-stage review process. At the initial stage, the joint editors will carry out a blind review to determine the eligibility of the paper for further review. On clearing the initial stage, the paper will be sent to the editorial board. A double-blind review process will be followed. Based on the editorial board's recommendations, the paper will be accepted, sent back to the authors to be revised. In case of non-acceptance, no separate information will be given.

#### **Publication Policy**

#### A. Publication ethics

NALSAR maintains a steadfast commitment to upholding the integrity of the academic record. Authors are strongly encouraged to consult the International Standards for Authors set forth by the Committee on Publication Ethics to ensure adherence to ethical principles throughout the research and publication process.

Manuscripts may be subject to rejection if the editors ascertain that the research has been conducted without due consideration of ethical standards. Moreover, any post-publication

concerns regarding ethical lapses may result in necessary corrections or retractions to uphold the credibility and integrity of the scholarly literature.

#### B. Plagiarism

NALSAR holds a stringent stance against copyright infringement, plagiarism, or any other violations of best practices in publication. Safeguarding the rights of our authors is paramount, and as such, we rigorously investigate any allegations of plagiarism or misuse of published papers. Additionally, we are committed to preserving the reputation of the journal and actively address instances of malpractice.

Submitted manuscripts are subject to scrutiny using duplication-checking and AI detecting softwares. Similarities of up to 10% or less are allowed. In cases where a paper is found to have plagiarized other works, utilized third-party copyright material without proper permission, or lacks sufficient acknowledgment, or if the authorship of the paper is contested, CCYJ, NALSAR reserves the right to take appropriate actions.

#### C. Prior publication

If material has been previously published, it is not acceptable for publication.

#### D. Contributor's Publishing Agreement

Prior to publication, the author, as the rights holder, has to sign a Journal Contributor's Publishing Agreement. This agreement constitutes an exclusive license agreement, wherein the author maintains copyright ownership of the work while granting NALSAR the sole and exclusive right and license to publish the work for the entire legal duration of copyright protection.

#### E. Open access

All the papers published in CCYJ, NALSAR Journal are made fully open access, thereby immediately and freely available for reading, downloading, and sharing(ccyj.nalsar.ac.in). Open access is provided to readers at no charge. The Journal is universally and freely accessible via the Internet in a user-friendly format.

The author(s) or copyright owner(s) grant(s) any third party the irrevocable right, in advance and perpetuity, to use, reproduce, or disseminate the article or book in part or in full, across any format or medium. However, this must be done without introducing substantive errors, while ensuring proper attribution of authorship, correct citation details, and clear indication if the article or book is reproduced or disseminated only in part. NALSAR affirms a

permanent commitment to maintaining this open access publishing policy, both retrospectively and prospectively, under any future circumstances, including any changes in ownership.

#### **How to submit Paper(s)**

Author(s) shall submit their manuscript through this <u>Google Form</u> only. Submissions made through any other mode will not be accepted. Each author is allowed to submit a maximum of 1 manuscript which is to be submitted in .doc or .docx format.

Deadline for the submission of the paper is 11:59 PM IST of 10 March, 2025.
